

ANNUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

01 January – 31 December 2004

I. PEACE AND ORDER SITUATION

A. CRIMINALITY

The populace of La Union continues to enjoy a peaceful atmosphere. This is due to the collective efforts of La Union PPO, law enforcement agencies, local government units and the community.

From 01 January – 31 December 2004, a total of **542** crime volume were registered. Of these, **219** were index crimes and **323** were non-index crimes. There were **161** crimes against persons while **58** crimes were committed against property.

Crime Volume for the period decreased by 5 incidents or 0.91% compared to same period last year. Likewise, index crime decreased by 14 cases or 6% , however, non-index crime increased by 9 or 2.87%.

The Average Monthly Crime Rate (AMCR) registered at 6.44 incidents per 100,000 population, a decrease of 0.17 incident compared to the previous period. Crime Solution Efficiency is recorded at 90.14% which increased by 0.83% compared to the same period last year.

B. INTERNAL SECURITY

The province of La Union remains an insurgent-free area. However, fourteen (14) sightings were monitored in the far-flung areas of Bagulin, San Juan, San Gabriel and Sudipen all of this province allegedly on foraging activities.

Fourteen (14) barangays are also considered as threatened due to its proximity to the far-flung barangays of the provinces of Ilocos Sur and Benguet where insurgent activity were monitored in these areas.

Furthermore, eighteen (18) NDF Organizations are monitored to be active in the province and these are under continuous police intelligence operations.

Likewise, four (4) Internal Security Operations and one hundred seventy (170) prophylactic patrols were conducted in remote barangays of Bagulin, San Gabriel, Santol and San Gabriel all of this province to deny LCTs in gaining foothold in AOR

4. Training and Education

To enhance administrative and operational capability of Police Stations/Units and to ensure the efficiency and effectiveness of their personnel in the discharge of their respective duties, this office has conducted in-service training programs participated in by a total of 1,981 PNP personnel,

6. Finance Management

Liquidation, disbursement and distribution of MOOE of this Office down to Police Stations to include PMG for the period in the total amount of P2,355,918

Maintenance of camp grounds was made possible by the allocation of funds for janitorial expenses in the amount of P89,200.

Prompt distribution of Replacement Clothing Allowance (RCA) for 71 personnel for the period in the amount of P 773,685.00

On Fund support, this Office received a total of P 5,312,702.74 from different LGUs in the form of office supplies, repairs and maintenance of vehicles, gasoline, and utility expenses.

9. Research and Development Services

In line with the career development program of the PNP, 12 personnel have undergone various Career Courses at RTS-1, Aringay, La Union broken down as follows: PSJLC- 7 and PSSLC- 5

B. Operations Services

1. Anti-Criminality Operations

a. Illegal Drugs

The sixteen (16) threatened to be affected barangays in AOR had been empowered at the end of the 3rd Quarter 2004, arrested one hundred thirty nine (139) drug personalities,(fifty four (54) listed in the watchlist while eighty five (85) were not listed).

b. Kidnap for Ransom – No incident reported

c. Street Crimes

A total of 113 street crimes were recorded where San Fernando City registered 97 cases committed in 12 barangays. The remaining 16 cases were registered at Bauang, Agoo and Sto Tomas and Naguilian.

The most prevalent street crimes committed were illegal drug activity with 96 cases followed by theft with 17 cases.

d. Carnapping

Conducted four (4) operations that resulted to the apprehension of two suspects and the recovery of 2 vehicles. Appropriate cases were filed in court.

e. Bank Robbery – No incident reported.

f. Hijacking/Hiway Robbery – No incident reported.

g. Violation of other Special Laws

Anti - Illegal Gambling

Conducted forty six (46) successful operations that resulted to the arrest of sixty five (65) persons and confiscation of cash bets amounting to **Php 17,674.00**, two (2) video machines and jueteng paraphernalia. Forty four (44) cases were filed in court.

Violation of RA 7610/working without permit

Conducted two (2) operations that resulted to the apprehension of nineteen (19) persons. One case was filed in court while the other were released after paying the corresponding fines.

Anti – Smut Operation Campaign (Pornography)

Aggressive campaign is being undertaken to prevent proliferation of smut magazines and pornographic materials in AOR with no cases reported.

Violation of RA 8485 (Animal Welfare Act)

Conducted five (5) operations that resulted to the apprehension of eleven (11) persons and the recovery of 297 heads of assorted native dogs. Items were later turned over to Animal Kingdom Foundation. Five (5) cases were filed in court.

Anti – Smuggling and Anti – Piracy

Conducted four (4) operations that resulted to the confiscation of 7,343 assorted pirated VCDs and DVDs and the apprehension of three (3) persons. Items were brought to 1st RCIDU for proper disposition.

Anti – Cattle Rustling

Conducted three (3) operations that resulted to the apprehension of four (4) persons and the recovery of one live cow and 2 live goats. Appropriate cases were filed in court.

Implementation of LOI Kalikasan (Anti-Illegal Logging)

Conducted eleven (11) operations that resulted to the arrest of fourteen (14) persons and the recovery of 7,237.7 bd ft of illegally cut timber woods with an estimated value of P195,660, 26 pieces wood carvings, 4 chainsaws and 1 Fuzo dropsied vehicle. Items were later turned over to DENR RO1 and 1st RCIDU for proper disposition.

Anti – Illegal Fishing

Conducted fourteen (14) operations that resulted to the apprehension of thirty two (32) persons and the confiscation of 3 fishing boats, fishing gears, 45 blasting caps, 94 homemade explosives, 3 weighing scales and 254 kgs of assorted fish. Six (6) cases were filed in court.

Violation of BP Blg 265 (Illegal Quarrying of Sand)

Conducted one successful operation that resulted to the apprehension of five (5) persons and the confiscation of 1 Fuso canter dropsied truck, 2 wheel barrows and four (4) spades. Appropriate case was already filed in court.

Violation of RA 9208 (Trafficking in Person and Pornography)

Conducted one successful operation that resulted to the apprehension of five (5) persons and the confiscation of three (3) computers with complete accessories. Appropriate case was filed in court.

Illegal Possession and Use of false Treasury or Bank and Other Instrument of Credit

Conducted one (1) operation which resulted to the arrest of two (2) persons and the confiscation of fake P1,000 peso bill. Case filed in court with CC# 3164.

Solicitation Permit Law (PD 1564)

Conducted one (1) operation which resulted to the arrest of three (3) persons. Case filed in court.

Illegal Use of Volatile Substance (PD 1619)

Conducted three (3) operations which resulted to the arrest of three (3) persons and the confiscation of 4 small plastics with rugby. Appropriate cases were filed in court.

Illegal Recruitment

One (1) successful operation which resulted to the arrest of one (1) person and the filing of appropriate charges in court.

2. Campaign Against Wanted Persons

a. Most Wanted Persons with Head Prize

Twelve (12) MWP with head prize were neutralized for the period posting a 52.17% accomplishment.

b. Most Wanted Persons without Head Prize

Out of the eighty nine (89) MWPs without head prize, eleven (11) were already neutralized posting a 12.36% accomplishment.

c. Wanted Persons listed in the provincial level – 28

d. Wanted Persons listed in the Municipal level - 418

4. Anti-Terrorism Efforts

a. Implementation of the Three-Tiered Defense System

No terrorist-related incident had been committed in AOR, however, simulation exercises adopting the three-tiered defense system namely: Intelligence build-up; Target Hardening and Incident Management was undertaken by this Office to establish a systematic coordinated and effective response to threats, acts of terrorism including disaster and calamities that may occur in the province.

b. Implementation of Bomb Incident Center (BIC)

No bomb-related cases has been reported in AOR, however, Bomb Incident Center (BIC) has been established at this Office to perform initial response whenever bomb incident occurs in AOR.

c. Participation of the Counter International Terrorism Intelligence Center (CITIC)

Close liaisoning with higher headquarters is being made from time to time.

c. Counter Terrorism Efforts

1) Formulated contingency plans for intensified police actions to ensure security of government/public vital installations/economic key points in AOR.

2) Conducted 84 security survey inspections over 50 vital installations/facilities in AOR. Likewise, continuous coordination and dialogue has been undertaken by this Office with security agencies being contributory in providing security services to the different vital facilities/banking/lending institutions in the province to prevent possible terrorist attacks.

3) Organized Provincial Crisis Management Committee chaired by Honorable Governor Victor Ortega and also all Police Stations have their MCM chaired by their respective Municipal Chief Executives.

d. Security Coverage/Foreign Visits/dignitaries)

Conducted 291 VIP security operations and 1,235 special events coverage with 83,483 man-hours spent for the operations.

C. Organizational Innovation

1. Targets set based on its Action Plan and Results

a) Maintenance of Crime Situation Map to serve as a focal point to initiate counter security measures.

b) 1,866 mobile checkpoints to deter criminal groups to pursue their nefarious activities in AOR.

c) Conducted 4 Internal Security Operations and 170 prophylactic patrols in remote barangays to deny LDTs in gaining foothold in AOR

d) Strictly implemented traffic rules and regulations particularly in traffic/accident prone areas.

e) Conducted 806 POC meetings/coordination and seminars/workshops with the different law enforcement agencies in the province to strengthen efforts in pursuit of attaining peace and order in AOR.

2. Implementation of COMPACT

Thirty (30) Police Assistance Centers in the province will serve as the Community Police Action Center for the meantime due to lack of funds.

3. Mobile Satellite Police Station

Organized one (1) Provincial Satellite Police Station to provide the facility to harness community-based and neighborhood support to police operations.

4. OFW Desk

Twenty (20) OFW Desks were established in all Police Stations in AOR and one (1) at the PPO to extended police services particularly to OFW and their families.

5. PNP Detective School

Regional Training School 1 is based at San Rita East, Aringay, La Union.

6. Council of Elders

The counter part of police actions against crime and criminals is the cooperation and support of the community. Leading the way in building stronger and dynamic neighborhood partnership is the Council of Community Leaders. A total of 160 councils and 241 meetings conducted in this province have been instrumental in providing feedback, identifying focus areas and harnessing the energy of the citizens as one collective unit for peace and order.

7. PNP Txt 2920

This office recorded a total of eight (8) text messages received and acted upon.

8. Community Participation – COPS Implementors

Thirty (30) PCPs were established by this Office provincewide manned by 106 personnel augmented by CVOs to address initial response to any call for police assistance.

9. Success Stories on Station Defense (Station to Active Defense)

La Union, compared to the other provinces of the region has a relatively low degree of insurgent affectation. No violent incidents recorded for the past several years. Likewise, a unified and integrated direction for public safety programs was made possible with the activation/operationalization of the Integrated Area/Community Public Safety Plan in all levels of this Office.

2. Campaign against organized/syndicated crime groups

No Organized/Syndicated Crime Groups in AOR.

2. Campaign against Criminal Gangs

Seventeen (17) Crime Gangs with fifty eight (58) leaders/members operating in the province were neutralized for the period.

E. Investigation Services

Collected 383 physical evidences and 409 testimonies taken and presented to court for various cases. Likewise, there were 301 documentary evidences for the period.

On case build up, 373 crimes were investigated. On prosecution, there were 302 cases filed, monitored in coordination made with the prosecutor.

On Service of Warrant / Order of Arrest, 383 Warrants of Arrest were received for the period. Out of which, all were duly served resulting to the arrest of 419 persons and a rating of 100% service of WAs. Additionally, A total of 300 court duties were attended by the investigators of this office.

On case tracking, 321 cases were processed, filed, monitored in coordination with the prosecutors in charge of the case.

F. Police Community Relations

For the period, the Office conducted 98 seminars to update our personnel on crime prevention efforts and 360 community/Barangay and school-oriented dialogues/ Symposium were conducted. Distributed 8,000 leaflets /handouts on crime prevention, public safety, bomb threats awareness, anti-terrorism and anti-drugs campaign materials.

Likewise, about 600 billboards/signboard and pictorials were displayed at strategic public places for information and guidance of the public regarding the Programs and Activities of this Office and in support to the programs and projects of the different Government Agencies, LGU's, NGO's and private/religious organization as our partners in crime prevention program of the PNP and the National Government.

Conducted 257 press releases to inform the public the reliability and competence of the PNP personnel.

Attended 265 radio program "Ugnayan Para Sa Bayan" at DZSO Radio Stations.

Community Assistance And Development

There were 288 Sportsfest conducted for the period by this Office both on outdoor and indoor games.

Conducted 283 medical/dental outreach program in far-flung barangays and served 31,347 patients.

Community Inter-Relations

A total of 260 projects had been implemented such as oplan linis, clean and green programs and Sunday Mass sponsored by different police station had been conducted and it geared high acceptance rating from the community.

Conducted 175 linkages with the different government agencies to strengthen and maximize efforts directed particularly addressing specific problems.

On CRACs this Office has recorded 1,188 referrals for the period.

Community Organization And Mobilization

There are 1,010 mobilization activities recorded for the period. CVO's involved themselves voluntarily during Parade, Fiestas, School Activities, Disaster Response and other Public Safety Services.

Female Juvenile Gender Sensitivity

As a framework for community organizing and social mobilization following activities were initiated to determine how issues of violence against women and children, the cycle of abuse that characterizes the abuser and the abused, gender discrimination, the commodification of women and children, the delinquency among minors and the prevalence of crimes committed now a days by young offenders, as well as the apathy and indifference from the family members and neighbors, including the lack of institutional mechanisms to address the root cause of them all ---- Family Violence--- have been found as among the many factors of rising incidence of crime and the concomitant phenomenon of man's inhumanity to man.

Provincewide, 127 different associations were organized, 61 of which are actively mobilizing for a certain cause -driven activity concentrating more on crime prevention.

Meetings/conferences/dialogues/ugnayan concerning families, women, children and youth with a total of 166 were initiated/attended by personnel assigned with the FJGSS; 95 innovations on projects that promotes crime prevention were also initiated/ participated activities in connection with national/local events relevant to families, women, youth/ children with 30 initiated training activities, solely or jointly with other organization and 55 generated appropriate assistance from GOs/NGOs/civic - oriented sectors.

The FJGSS has also been involved in 101 community-based projects and programs initiated by other GOs/NGOs/civic-oriented groups with 186 visitation activities in schools, churches, family homes, homeowners association, youth/women society groups; barangay centers.

G. International linkages

Regular liaisoning with higher headquarters were being conducted.

III. PLANS AND PROGRAMS

In consonance with the **C.A.R.E** Program Thrust of the C, PNP and in support to the SILG's Four Priority Actions for the PNP, this Office shall undertake the following continuing activities:

1. Close liaisoning with LGUs, other Law Enforcement Agencies and Intelligence Units to conduct intensified intelligence, counterintelligence and security operations to prevent enemy attacks on vital installations and economic key points.
2. Conduct of Checkpoints at strategic points.
3. Inspect Police Stations to ensure alertness and operational readiness of personnel .
4. Enhance linkages and networking with multi-sectoral groups to develop unity in crime prevention.
5. Medical/Dental Mission shall be pursued in support to ISO and LGU program.
6. Moral Recovery/Values Formation Programs shall be pursued to uplift police image.
7. Conduct of In-Service training and seminars for professional growth and career development of all personnel.
