

ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

(January – December 2005)

I. ADMINISTRATIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

PROMOTION

La Union PPO has been very accommodating in the matter of processing of promotion papers of deserving and qualified personnel. For the period, two personnel were promoted from PCINSP to PSUPT

LOI PATNUBAY

On LOI PATNUBAY, eight (8) personnel of this Office were meted with punishments: 4 were suspended and 4 were reprimanded.

T.A.B.A. Cops

Nine (9) personnel were reported to have violated this directive of the C, PNP.

Trainings and Seminars

To enhance administrative and operational effectiveness of personnel, 31 in - service trainings and seminars were conducted and participated in by 2,178 personnel.

Morale and Welfare Benefits Programs

Various awards and recognitions were given to 2,165 personnel for their exemplary performance and efficient services:

II. OPERATIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1) Illegal Drugs

From 01 January to 20 November 2004, sixteen (16) barangays in AOR were categorized as threatened with fifty four (54) identified drug personalities. All the barangays were empowered at the end of the 3rd Quarter 2004. Aggressive and sustained operations conducted resulted to the arrest/neutralization of one hundred thirty nine (139) drug personalities, fifty four (54) listed in the watchlist while eighty five (85) not listed. The Office confiscated

35.81 gms of shabu, **258.56 grams** of dried marijuana leaves and destroyed **240,001** fully grown MJ plants with a total DDB Value of **P48,078,084.00**. Eighty (80) cases were filed in court.

2. Violation of Other Special Laws

a. RA 8294 (Loose Firearms)

- Conducted forty nine (49) operations that resulted in the apprehension of forty six (46) persons and the confiscation/recovery of fifty four (54) firearms. Twenty six (26) cases were filed in court

b. RA 9287 (Illegal Gambling)

- Conducted forty one (41) operations that resulted in the apprehension of one hundred six (106) persons and the confiscation/recovery of P16,954.70 cash bets. Forty one (41) cases were filed in court.

c. RA 8550 (Illegal Fishing)

- Conducted forty (40) operations that resulted in the apprehension of two hundred seventy (270) persons and the confiscation/recovery of 4,229 kilograms of dynamited fish, 25 home made explosives, 12 improvised blasting caps, fishing vessels and various fishing gears. Twenty five (25) cases were filed in court

d. PD 705 (Illegal Logging)

- Conducted thirteen (13) operations that resulted in the apprehension of five (5) persons and the confiscation/recovery of 4,436.64 bd ft & 159 flitches assorted woods. Items were later turned-over to CENRO for proper disposition.

e. RA 8485 (Animal Welfare Act)

- Conducted three (3) operations that resulted in the apprehension of nine (9) persons and the confiscation/recovery of 110 assorted native dogs. Five (5) cases were filed in court.

f. RA 9239 (Optical Media Act of 2003)

- Conducted two (2) operations that resulted in the confiscation/recovery of 90 big sacks and 108 assorted CDs. Items were turned over to CIDG-1 for proper disposition.

g. PD 1619 (Sniffing of Volatile Substance)

- Conducted two (2) operations that resulted in the apprehension of two (2) persons and the confiscation/recovery of 2 bottles of rugby. Two (2) cases were filed in court.

h. Anti-Cattle Rustling

- Conducted three (3) operations that resulted in the apprehension of one persons and the confiscation/recovery of 2 goats and 1 large cattle. One cases was filed in court.

3. Police Visibility

Thirty (30) Police Assistance Centers are being maintained and manned by 109 PNP personnel on rotation basis.

Conducted 29,760 foot patrols with the support of CVOs as force multipliers with 438,080 man-hours consumed. Also, 7,300 mobile patrols were conducted and consumed 58,400 man-hours.

On checkpoints, a total of 1,380 operations were conducted and consumed 47,879.5 man hours.

On traffic management, a total of 7,300 operations were conducted with augmentation from brgy tanods. A total of 351,802 man hours were spent.

4. Intelligence Matters

La Union is a “ **White Area** “ under the Ilocos Cordillera Regional Committee (ICRC). No violent incident was committed that can be attributed to terrorist activities. However, Internal Security Operations were conducted along the tri-boundaries of Ilocos Sur, Benguet and La Union to thwart possible encroachment of the LCTs from adjacent provinces into our AOR and prevent them from gaining foothold in the area.

Likewise, 18 NDF Organizations are monitored to be active in the province and these are under continuous police intelligence operations.

5. Logistics Matters

On ammunitions, 6,372 rds for Cal 5.56; 4,128 rds for Cal. 9mm and 1,598 rds for Cal 45 were received from higher Office and were reissued to

the different police stations who are in need of ammos and were spent during the SWAT and SCOUT trainings conducted by this Office.

On Gasoline Allocation, this office received from PRO1 a total of 75,925.49 liters of XCS-PLUS Gasoline amounting to One million nine hundred ninety eight and ninety six centavos for the period covered. This allocation was distributed to all Unit/PSs under this office through the distribution scheme made by higher office.

On Fund support, this Office received a total of P 5,160,645.61 from different LGUs in the form of office supplies, repairs and maintenance of vehicles, gasoline, and utility expenses.

6. Investigation Matters

1. Inventory of Unsolved Cases

As of 31 December 2004, 97 cases remain unsolved. However, from the 151 original list of unsolved cases for the last three (3) years, fifty four (54) cases were already solved which is 35.76% accomplishment in the solution of unsolved cases.

3. Inventory and Neutralization of Criminal Groups

There were seventeen (17) newly identified criminal gangs that were immediately neutralized for the calendar year 2004.

Likewise, twenty six (26) Criminal Gangs identified for the last three (3) years were all neutralized.

4. Inventory and Neutralization of Most Wanted Persons with Head Prize

Twelve (12) MWP with head prize were neutralized for the period.

6. Criminality

Crime Volume for the period increased by 7 incidents or 1.43% compared to same period last year. Likewise, index crime decreased by 14 cases or 6.48% , however, the non-index crime increased by 21 or 7.66%.

The Average Monthly Crime Rate (AMCR) registered at 6.45 incidents per 100,000 population, a decrease of 0.01 incident compared to the previous period. Crime Solution Efficiency is recorded at 90.74% which increased by 0.67% compared to the same period last year.

7. PCR Matters

LU PPO Multi-purpose cooperative has been registered with the Cooperative Development Authority under Registration No. DAC – 4422. on September 2001 and was newly reactivated on 18 October 2004. All personnel were encouraged to become members of said cooperative.

On house clustering organization, one thousand one hundred thirty four (1,134) house clusters were formed with 13,997 houses involved.

8. Finance Matters

1. Liquidation, disbursement and distribution of MOOE of this Office down to Police Stations to include PMG for the period in the total amount of P2,002,345

2. Maintenance of camp grounds was made possible by the allocation of funds for janitorial expenses in the amount of P77,800.00

3. Prompt distribution of Replacement Clothing Allowance (RCA) for 71 personnel for the period in the amount of P 773,685.00

9. Plans Matters

a. This Office conforms to the recommended eight (8) Directorial Staff Office.

b. This Office conforms to the abolition of PNP Maritime Group and to be devolved to the provincial offices with territorial waters and rivers.

c. This Office does not conform to the abolition of the sixteen (16) Police Regional Offices because it is violative of the principle of span and control. However, this Office conforms to the proposed creation of area police offices similar to AFP set-up.

d. This Office conforms to the proposed restructuring and streamlining of PPOs.

e. This Office conforms to the upgrading of the rank of RD, NCRPO to Police Deputy Director General and the abolition of the five NCR Districts.

f. This Office conforms to the retention of PNP Directorial Staff System.

g. This Office conforms to the expanded functions of the Security and Protection Group.

h. This Office conforms to the upgrading of ranks for certain key positions in the PNP in view of salary standardization.

III. ASSESSMENT

Criminality

The adoption of the Four SILG's Priority Actions for the PNP through the conduct of regular police visibility operations, intensified law enforcement and other crime prevention measures of La Union PPO in support to the C.A.R.E. Program Thrusts of the C, PNP resulted to an improving peace and order situation in the province.

Illegal Drugs

The combined efforts of La Union PPO and Anti-Drug Abuse Councils, LGUs , NGOs and community support resulted to the neutralization of all targeted drug personalities and empowerment of all drug affected barangays in the province. Nevertheless, continuous operations is being conducted for the arrest of suspected drug personalities.

Internal Security

The province of La Union is a "white-area" under the Ilocos Cordillera Regional Committee (ICRC), However, LCTs from other provinces could be a threat to the peace and order situation of the province. The reported sightings/ movements in the far-flung areas of the province has been acted upon through the conduct of regular Internal Security Operations (ISO) and barangay visitations. These ISO operations are preventing them from gaining foothold and establish mass base support in our AOR.
